#### **Outcomes:**

At successful completion of **Music 234**, student will be able to analyze diatonic works with a greater understanding of voice leading and phrase structure. They will be able to compose longer chorales in four voices using good voice leading, incorporating seventh chords and multiple cadence points. Students will have an introduction to secondary chords and modulation. They will have been shown how to use these skills as they apply to their own instrument or voice to better understand and interpret their own music. Students will integrate the use of *Finale*, a music writing computer program, in their homework assignments, furthering their knowledge and facility of its use.
