Paperwork:

The packet the student brings to the continuation for each committee member should contain:

- 1. The "Record of Continuation Examination" form.
- 2. This "Music Major Record" form.
- 3. His/her most recent degree audit.
- 4. "Course Checklist and Suggested Sequence," with grades for completed courses and anticipated semester of completion for remaining courses.
- 5. "Unofficial" transcript from AccessPlus.
- 6. Course plan for the remaining semesters listing courses to be taken each semester. List department, course name, number, and credits for each course, and total credits for each semester. For courses fulfilling general education requirements, indicate the requirement. ("Social Sciences," "Humanities," etc.)
- 7. "Essay:" A one-page typed statement of the student's personal goals, self-assessment of progress thus far, and, assessment of what he/she needs/wants to accomplish before graduation. This essay should be an example of the student's best writing and will be read not only for content, but also for style and organization. The personal goals statement might include the student's goals for future employment; the self-assessment should address the student's qualifications for that goal--why he/she aspires to that goal, and why he/she thinks that a particular goal is right for him/her.
- 8. Copies of the music to be performed. For instrumentalists, the instrumental part (without accompaniment) is adequate. In cases, such as keyboard exams, where a copy for each committee member would result in an exorbitant number of pages, fewer copies may be acceptable. Consult with your applied teacher.
