1. This “Record of Continuation Examination” form
2. Most recent degree audit
3. 4-year plan (<https://www.music.iastate.edu/degrees>)
4. Microsoft word or excel document with course plan for remaining semesters. List courses to be taken each semester. List department, course name, number, and credits for each course, and total credits for each semester.
5. Essay: A one-page typed statement of a student’s personal goals, self-assessment of progress thus far, and, assessment of what they want to accomplish before graduation. This essay should be an example of the student’s best writing and will be read not only for content, but also for style and organization.
6. Copies of the music to be performed. For instrumentalists, the instrumental part (without accompaniment) is adequate. Consult with your applied teacher if you have any questions.
