Sight Singing: All students are expected to practice the assigned sight singing examples **prior** to class. Individual students will be called upon randomly to sing in class. All sight singing assignments are listed in the syllabus and NOT on Canvas.

Outcomes: At the successful completion of **Music 345**, students will be able to identify by ear all intervals and most scales and diatonic/chromatic chord progressions. They will be able to take melodic dictation in diatonic and simple chromatic and modulating melodies as well as rhythmic dictation in both simple and compound rhythmic patterns. They will be able to sight sing simple chromatic and modulating melodies using Solfège syllables. They will be able to detect errors in melodic, harmonic and rhythmic phrases.
