# Course Description

The goal of this course is to facilitate student growth as they make the transition from being students to professional performing arts practitioners and artists, as well as global citizens. The format of the course primarily consists of group seminar discussions and the independent development of students' professional materials.

Specific seminar subjects will be determined based on student interest and input, but topics of discussion may include professional ethics, career planning strategies, advanced training opportunities, union membership, alternative career paths within the industry, financial planning, work-life balance, and emerging trends in the performing arts.

Within the course students will undertake a capstone project, which includes the development of a professional website, a portfolio self-assessment and critique, and a final reflection and presentation. This project serves as a culmination of their entire university course of study, integrating and showcasing the knowledge and experiences gained throughout their university journey.
